It can feel like a lot to keep up with, and some years maybe too much to tackle at all. I've found that a few smart styling strategies can help you seamlessly transition your home from cozy autumn to holiday-ready in no time. The key is choosing pieces that work double duty, so you're not completely starting from scratch in just a few short weeks.

Keep the Warm Foundation

Engage the Senses
